CCMES will increase the level of math proficiency by aligning instruction with the Nevada Academic Content Standards.

#### Objective(s):

Teachers will develop targeted instructional groups, use academic vocabulary, the eight mathematical practices and HQSI strategies to improve achievement as measured by DCSD MAP assessments, Nevada CRTs.

#### Goal 3

CCMES will implement Tier One Strategies for Positive Behavior Intervention Supports.

#### Objective(s):

Students will be directly taught social expectations in a school setting such as: behavior management, self-regulation, and resilience in the face of adversity to help increase student engagement and availability for learning.

### School Communication Efforts

C.C. Meneley Elementary School encourages and supports communication between home and school. This is accomplished through the use of school and classroom newsletters, weekly student folders and daily planners. The annual Back to School Night held in August provides families with specific information on classroom expectations and grade level curriculum. Parent conferences, phone calls and individual meetings for IEPs and 504s are held. The school website, bulletin board and marquee are updated regularly and PowerSchool provides current grades. Teachers utilize notes, phone calls and email in addition to personal conversations before and after school. Our families are encouraged to participate in activities outside of the school day too - Merry Market Night, Science Fair, Invention Convention, Friendship Dinner, Bingo Nights, Art Show, Music Concert, D.A.R.E. graduation, Food for Thought Nights, ESL Family Nights and Parent Teacher Organization meetings.
